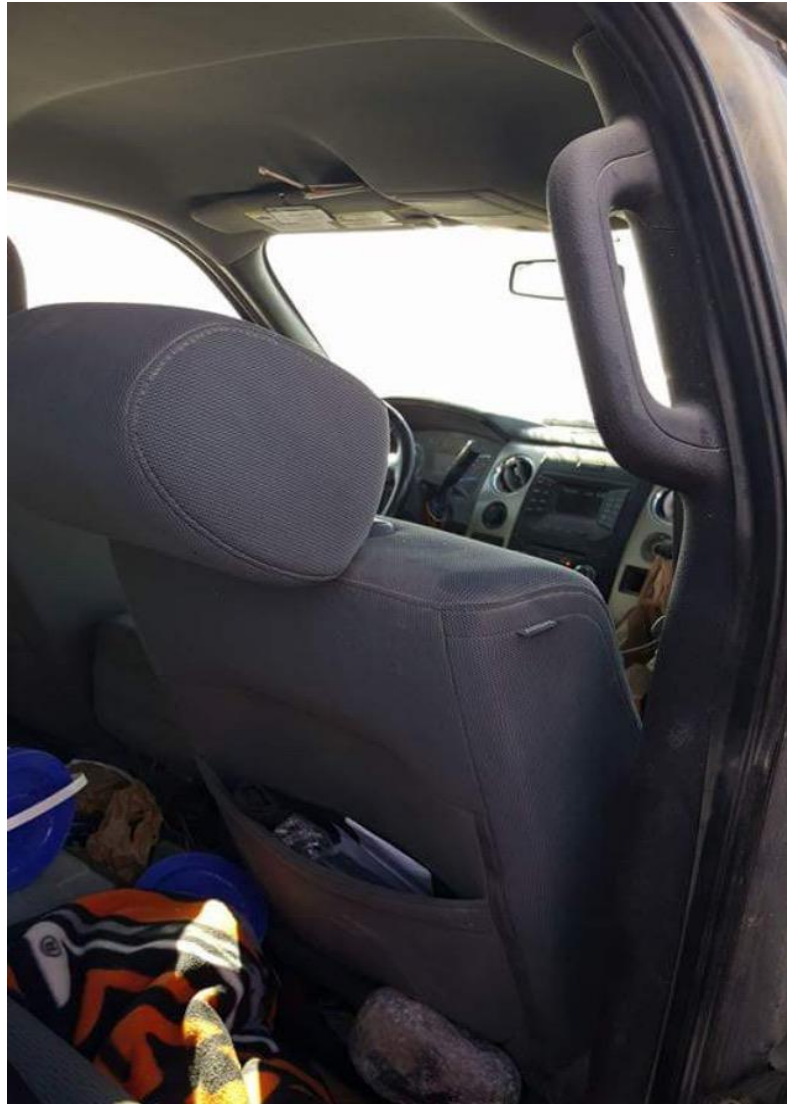
Ensure Tires and Equipment are free from Rocks



What Happened (Non-Shell Related)

- Driver was traveling from New Mexico to Texas on Hwy 285 towards Orla
- Just after crossing into Texas a rock was thrown from oncoming truck.
- Rock came thru driver side front windshield, hitting the steering wheel which took most of the blunt of the hit.
- Driver was not injured

Summary

- Before leaving yard or site, do a 360 walk-around to ensure there are no loose objects and that everything is secure.
- After traveling a route with large rocks on the road, a good recommendation would be to stop before entering highway to ensure there are no rocks trapped between the dual tires.
- If hauling material with large rocks, do a 360 walk around after dumping to ensure there are no rocks between the dual tires or trapped in other areas that could become dislodged on the highway.

Consider this:

What if it were a family member or even a co-worker that was following your truck that lost a large item off of the load or that a large rock became dislodged and went thru their windshield.
